Register online to bring TVs and Electronics Items to the May 18 Residential Electronics Collection

Champaign County and participating municipalities in Champaign County will hold two Residential Electronics Collection (REC) events at Parkland College in 2019, on **May 18** and **October 12**. Residents of unincorporated Champaign County and residents of participating municipalities are eligible to register online to participate. Eligible residents need to advance register online at ecycle.simplybook.me for the May 18 REC. Online advance registration starts Monday, April 8, 2019. Eligible residents who register online may bring up to four TVs per household to the REC event. The four TVs may be any type or size, functioning or non-functioning. Each TV should be intact and not in pieces.

Residential Electronics Collection Details

The spring Residential Electronics Collection (REC) takes place on Saturday May 18, 2019, from 8 am to noon, at Parkland College, located at 2400 W. Bradley Avenue in Champaign.

Gifford residents are eligible to register to attend the May 18 REC event at <u>ecycle.simplybook.me</u>. On this registration website, you select a specific appointment time to bring up to seven electronics items from the list of accepted items, with a limit of four TVs per household.

Once you are registered for the May 18, 2019 REC event, you will receive a postcard in the mail approximately two weeks before the REC event. The postcard will serve as your ticket into the REC event. If you do not receive your postcard by May 15th, you can provide your confirmation email/text at the REC event when you arrive. Or, if you do not have a postcard or a confirmation email/text, please call (217) 403-4780 before May 17, 2019.

As noted, the REC event takes place at Parkland College, 2400 W. Bradley Ave, Champaign. Registered participants must use the DUNCAN ROAD ENTRANCE and then follow the signs.

Car pooling is allowed & encouraged. You can use multiple postcards for one vehicle.

ASSISTANCE IS PROVIDED removing items from your vehicle. Please do not have anything surrounding your electronics that you do not want taken out of your vehicle! The REC events go ahead rain or shine, that includes thunder & lightning. Keep in mind that rain will slow things down, but the wait is still minimal. The weather would have to get very severe before we cancel.

Bring only accepted electronics items to the REC event. Up to seven accepted items per household, with a limit of four TVs per household. See the list of **Accepted Electronics** Items that is provided below.

NOT Accepted ... Do NOT Bring these Electronics Items:

- Stereo speakers (wooden, metal, or plastic)
- Vacuum cleaners
- Lamps or fans
- Small appliances (blenders, coffee makers, toasters, etc.)
- Cash registers
- Liquid-containing items
- Freon-containing items (AC units, dehumidifiers)
- White goods (e.g., refrigerators, freezers, dishwashers)
- Thermostats
- Smoke alarms or carbon monoxide detectors
- Light bulbs, fluorescent bulbs or tubes
- Loose alkaline batteries (except while contained in electronics devices)
