Regular Meeting April 7, 2022

The Village Board of Trustees met at 7:00 p.m. in the Gifford Village Building to hold their regular monthly meeting. Officers and Trustees present were President Ackerman and Trustees, Hammond, Harris, McFadden, Pannbacker, Severins and Starkey. Treasurer Christie Huls, Clerk Diane Baker, Water/Maintenance/Zoning Jon Couture were all present. Chief Weary was absent.

Pledge of Allegiance and roll call.

Dave Bletscher presented information about automated sirens.

Mike Airing had the paperwork to sign for the WWTP aeration system replacement/IEPA construction permit application, calculations and equipment design. The paperwork was all signed.

Trustee Pannbacker made a motion to approve the WWTP aeration system replacement/IEPA construction permit application, calculations and equipment design. It was seconded by Trustee McFadden. All trustees concurred in a roll call vote (6 yes, 0 no).

Travis Youmans was present to talk about water issues at his house. He has had water two times now. The first time his pump failed. He said he feels he has exhausted possibilities of this being his problem. He has spent money and time. He has recruited many community members to help and some were present at the meeting. Some digging to look for cause has already taken place.

Lots of different ideas and avenues to look at. Tony McLain offered the Village a 1% loan for a tile project. Justin Fullenkamp would like to know where all the tiles are and where they go. Jonathan will get him this information.

Trustee Pannbacker made a motion to approve digging for a tile at a lot located by the pond. It was seconded by Trustee Severins. All trustees concurred in a roll call vote (6 yes, 0 no).

Each Trustee and Officer had been furnished minutes of the last regular meeting. Trustee Pannbacker made a motion to dispense with the reading of the minutes. It was seconded by Trustee Starkey. All trustees concurred in a roll call vote (6 yes, 0 no). Trustee Pannbacker made a motion to accept the minutes as read. It was seconded by Trustee Starkey. All trustees concurred in a roll call vote (6 yes, 0 no).

Each Trustee and Officer had been furnished printed copies of the bills to be considered for payment. Trustee Hammond made a motion to dispense with the reading of the bills. It was seconded by Trustee Harris. All Trustees concurred in a roll call vote (6 yes, 0 no). Trustee Pannbacker made a motion to pay the bills with the addition of \$2,029.75 to EPA. It was seconded by Trustee Hammond. All Trustees concurred in a roll call vote (6 yes, 0 no).

Each Trustee and Officer had been furnished printed copies of the Treasurer's Report, Trustee Pannbacker made a motion to dispense with the reading of the Treasurer's Report, except for the summary. It was seconded by Trustee Starkey. All Trustees concurred in a roll call vote (6 yes, 0 no). The starting balance in Village accounts as of March 1, 2022 was \$1,305,269.63. Total money received for the month of March 2022 was \$74,084.21 plus \$5.80 interest from CD#15399 and \$6.43 interest from CD#8170. Total expenses for the month were \$56,276.98 leaving a balance on March 31, 2022 of \$1,323,089.09.

The contract for dredging needs to be changed because of prevailing wages.

Trustee Pannbacker made a motion to approve the changed contract for dredging to \$122,029.00. It was seconded by Trustee Severins. All trustees concurred in a roll call vote (6 yes, 0 no).
